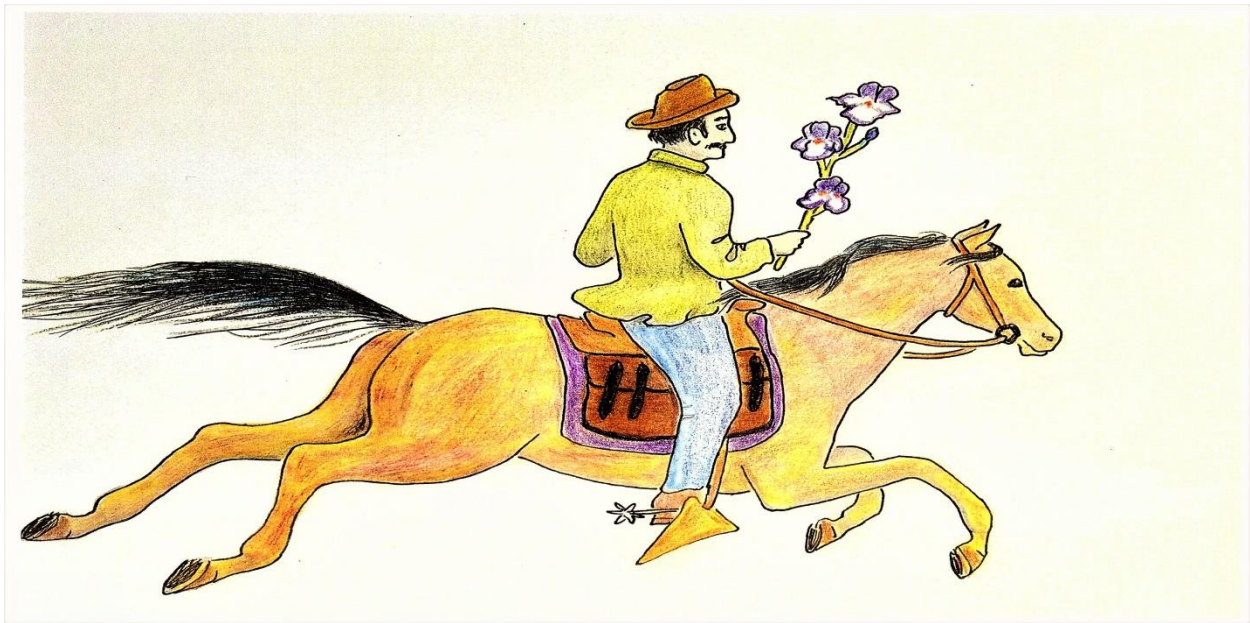

Group 3 Gold Fever---Designer’s Choice using yellow or gold iris in design.

Group 4 Wild West---Designer’s Choice

Artistic Design Rules

Entries are open to the public

Standard AIS entry tags will be furnished by the Show Committee and must be used. The top and bottom of the tag will be filled in by the Exhibitor. In Division V, Artistic, class is the name of the arrangement. Each design should be accompanied by a 3" by 5" card listing all plant material used, including the Cultivar name, if possible. This show will be conducted in accordance with the American Iris Society Rules and regulations approved by the American Iris Society Board of Directors. All Exhibits and Awards shall remain in place until after the close of the show. The Show Committee will exercise all possible care but it is not responsible for loss or damage to exhibits. The Show Committee will remove any spent blossoms during the show and will dispose of all entries not claimed by the Exhibitor at the end of the show. Officiating judges may not enter any of the sections in which they are judging without prior approval from the show committee.

One or more iris blooms must be used in each arrangement and should be the dominant flower(s) in the design. The use of iris foliage in a design is the choice of the designer. The design must be made by the exhibitor, but plant material used in the design DOES NOT have to have been grown by the designer. Accessories are permitted in all classes.

All fresh plant material must be used and may not be treated. Dried plant material permitted, and it may be treated. No flags, artificial flowers, foliage, fruit or vegetables are permitted. The use of any part (s) of plants on the state conservation list is strictly prohibited. An exhibitor may enter only one arrangement per class, but may enter as many classes as desired. Space allowed for each design is 18" wide by 18" deep and will be displayed on a covered table. Height is unlimited within reason of the room height. This section is not eligible for the Best Specimen of Show Award.

GENERAL EXHIBITION RULES

Entries are open to the public

This accredited show is being held and judged under the rules and regulations of The American Iris Society as set forth in the Handbook for Judges and Show Officials, 7th Edition, 2007, and subsequent rules and regulations approved by the AIS Board of Directors. The official rules and regulations cannot be violated. Entries are open to the public, and will be accepted Friday, April 21, from 3:30pm to 5:30pm. All exhibitors must leave the exhibition area by 5:30 to permit the Show Committee to complete the placement of entries. Judging will start at 6pm. No one other than judges, clerks and show committee will be permitted in the area during judging. Officiating judges may not enter any of the sections in which they are judging without prior approval from the show committee.

All specimens must be correctly named, labeled and entered in the proper horticultural division. Each entry must be a different variety and **must** be grown, groomed and accompanied by the exhibitor. Only one iris of the variety may be exhibited by any one exhibitor. There is no restriction on the number of entries per exhibitor. Members from a family may exhibit from the same garden. All containers will be furnished by the Show Committee and must be used. Region 14 is not responsible for lost or damaged plant materials, containers, etc.

Seedlings must be entered under seedling number or registered name and must be entered in the name of the owner or originator of the clone. Bulbous iris are not eligible for Best Specimen of Show. All exhibits and awards must remain in place until the end of the show. The show will be dismantled at 12:00pm on Sunday April 23, 2017. No pollen may be taken from any iris without the express, written permission of the exhibitor.

Best Specimen of Show Award and Best of Section Awards and Certificates.

Silver Medal/Certificate and Bronze Medal/Certificate will be awarded.

Special Award may be awarded at the Judge's discretion to not more than 5% of the entries. AIS Exhibition Certificate will be awarded to the Best Seedling or to any other seedlings receiving 5 or more votes from AIS Judges attending the show.

Youth awards shall be the same as given in Regular Divisions.
